

Fabaceae (Pea Family)

Phenology: flowering begins in late March and continues through May. Mature fruit follows in late April through July.

Management Responsibility: USFS (Coronado NF), NPS (Chiricahua NM).

Similar Species: *A. cobrensis* var. *cobrensis* is geographically separated (found only in Gila River drainage) with glabrous upper leaflet surfaces, stems with strigulose hairs and the calyx has more white hairs than black.

Notes: monitoring in Pinery Canyon has shown reduction in plant numbers that seems to be related to the dispersed recreational use of the area.

Astragulus cobrensis var. maguuirei

Habitat: plants are associated with canyon bottoms in full sun (often on rocky soil) or partial shade (growing on organic soils amongst leaf litter), 5,500-7,000 ft (1676-2133 m) elevation. Plants are found in pinyon/juniper, alligator juniper/mixed oak and pine/oak woodlands.
