
var. cremnophylax

Dwarf, evergreen, perennial, matforming herb, 2-25 cm in diameter



Fabaceae (Pea Family)


Phenology: flowering late April to May, rarely a second flowering following summer rains, fruiting May to June.

Management Responsibility: NPS (Grand Canyon NP).

Similar Species: distinguished from var. *myriorrphaphis* by lack of spinescent leaf bases; from var. *hevronii* by smaller flowers; and *A. calycosus* by unilocular fruits and teeny leaflets.

Notes: the main population of about 500 individuals is protected and has been monitored since 1988. Two other areas are known, one of which may prove to be a new variety.
