
Low, loosely tufted, shortly caulescent perennial




Fabaceae (Pea Family)

Phenology: flowering May to June.

Management Responsibility: Navajo Nation.

Similar Species: differs from *A. flavus* var. *candicans* by the slightly accrescent calyx, withering but persistent petals, and fewer ovules.




Astragalus sophoroides

Habitat: commonly on red Moenkopi Sandstone, sandy flats and knolls, ledges and in sandy pockets of dry cliffs and desert washes; forming colonies, but very local. Great Basin desertscrub community, 4,200 to 5,000 ft (1280-1525 m) elevation.
