

**Phenology:** flowering April to June; can flower a second time in August.


**Management Responsibility:** NPS (Petrified Forest NP), Navajo Nation, BLM (Safford Field Office), private.

Synonyms: A. convallarioides var. xiphoides Barneby.

**Similar species:** *A. ceramicus* has an extensive network of pallid, creeping rhizomes; mostly pink-tinged or pink-veined flowers; and a highly mottled, inflated pod. *A. lonchocarpus* differs in its more abundant leaflets, larger, yellow to cream colored flowers, 13.5-19.5 mm long vs. up to 9 mm, stipitate pod compressed contrary to the sutures.

Astragalus xiphoides




derived from shale with a gypsiferous component washes, floodplains, or
