
Clustered Leather Flower

var. hirsutissima



Phenology: flowering late April through June, fruiting July to August.

Management Responsibility: USFS (Coconino NF, Kaibab NF), AZ State Land Dept, Navajo Nation, NPS (Grand Canyon NP).

Synonyms: Clematis hirsutissima Pursh var. arizonica (Heller) Erickson

Similar Species: other Clematis are vine-forming.

Notes: Erickson recognized plants from the Flagstaff area as a var. *arizonica*, while some taxonomists place these plants in synonymy with the typical variety.



Clematis hirsutissima var. hirsutissima

Habitat: in Arizona occurs in moist mountain meadows. prairies, and open woods and thickets usually in limestone soils of ponderosa pine and mixed conifer forests, 6,800 to 9,000 ft (2075-2745 m) elevation.





Range: known from the Flagstaff vicinity along the Rio de Flag and Lower Lake Mary, upper Volunteer Canyon, the Tusayan area, and the Chuska Mountains, and western U.S.
