

Phenology: flowers from July to mid-September, the fruit can persist through October.

Management Responsibility: USFS (Coronado NF), DoD-US Army (Ft. Huachuca).

Synonyms: Cracca edwardsii var. glabella (A. Gray), Benthamantha grayi var. glabella (A. Gray) Britton & Baker

Similar Species: can be confused with *C. caribaea* var. *sericea* which is woody, has an erect habit, leaves with 13 or fewer leaflets and whitish to pink flowers.

Notes: only herbaceous *Coursetia* in America. Look for tannin deposits in the veins on the underside of the leaflets.

Habitat: dry, partially shaded slopes in Madrean oak woodland, oak-juniper and pine-oak forest at elevations of 5,000-7,200 ft (1700-2200 m).





Range: Patagonia Mountains, Canelo Hills, and Huachuca Mountains.
