


Phenology: flowering August through October.

Management Responsibility: DoD-US Army (Ft. Huachuca).

Similar Species: could be confused with *E. lobatus* or *E. divergens*, but these species have upright divergent branching habits compared with the clumping, prostrate, decumbent habit of *E. lemmonii* which is also restricted to rock or cliff faces.


Notes: in 1989, population reported as a total of 108 clumps, all producing flowers and fruits.

Habitat: in crevices of west, south and north facing cliffs in shady habitat, 6,300-7,300 ft (1920-2225 m) elevation.
