

Asteraceae (Sunflower Family)


Phenology: flowering May to June.

Management Responsibility: Navajo Nation.

Similar Species: distinct from other *Erigerons* by its rhizomatus habit, nearly hairless achenes, with 5-6 nerves, and very few hairs on the stems and leaves.

Notes: discovered in 1999 in Arizona, disjunct from main range in New Mexico.





Habitat: in Arizona, E. rhizomatus is associated with the Church Rock and Owl Rock member of the Chinle Formation in ponderosa pine communities at 7,600 ft. (2316 m) On exposed slopes with little other vegetation.





Range: in Arizona only known from one population on the eastside of the Chuska Mountains; also found in New Mexico (McKinley and Catron counties).
