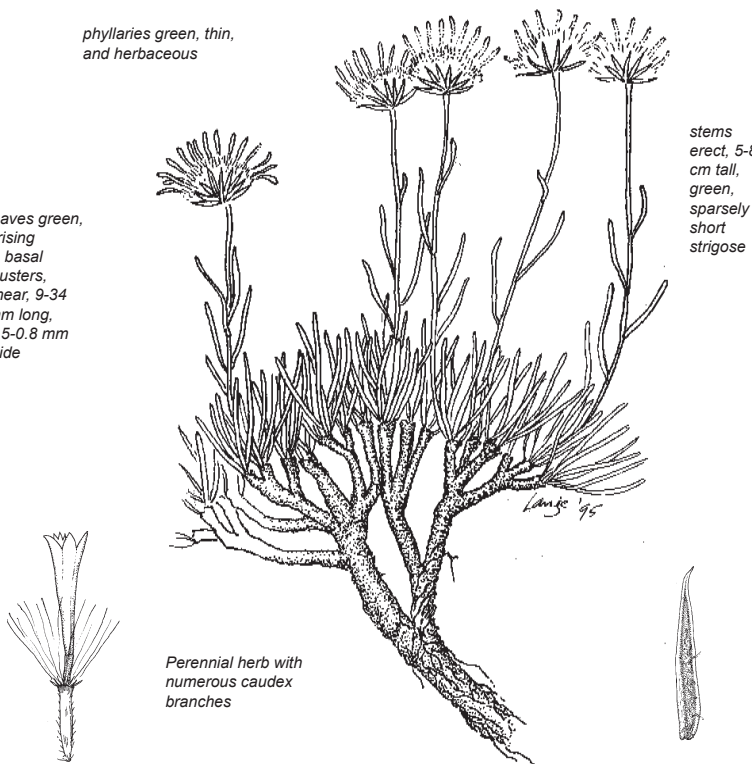


heads solitary; ray flowers 21-33,

Asteraceae (Sunflower Family)

Phenology: flowers from late May through June.

Management Responsibility: Navajo Nation.

Similar Species: the stems, leaves, and phyllaries of *E. consimilis* are gray green; its stems are scapose, and its phyllaries are thickened along the margins.

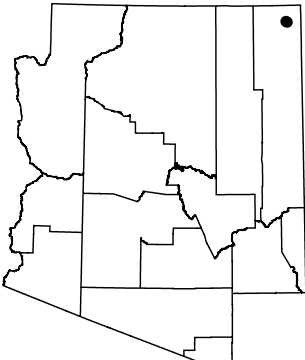
