

Polygonaceae (Knotweed/Buckwheat Family)

Phenology: flowering and fruiting July-October.

Management Responsibility: BLM (AZ Strip Field Office), Kaibab Band of Paiute Indians, AZ Dept of Transportation.

Similar Species: *Eriogonum mortonianum* has elliptic leaves which are glabrous on both sides. *E. corymbosum* has elliptic leaves which are hairy on both surfaces. Hybrid intermediates are at least as common as the parent taxa. They are difficult to distinguish when leafless in winter.

Eriogonum thompsonae var. atwoodii

Habitat: usually along small drainages in red gypseous sandy-clay soils derived from Moenkopi Formation outcrops; Great Basin desertscrub, 4,650 ft (1420 m) elevation.







Range: west of Fredonia and near Lost Spring Mountain.
