

*Herbaceous perennial,
leafy to top*

*pedicels and bracts
covered with wavy
hairs; yellow*

*erect stems 60
cm tall, which
are covered to its
middle with wavy
pubescence
and above are
smooth*



*loose corymb-like
inflorescence
generally supports
up to 23 flowering
heads incased in
an involucre of
12-14 bracts*

*leaves are sessile
to the stem and are
lance and oblong
in shape with
pubescence covering
both surfaces*

Asteraceae (Sunflower Family)

Phenology: grows and flowers with late summer monsoon rains.

Management Responsibility: USFS (Coronado NF).

Notes: of the four known sites in Arizona, only one site (in the Huachuca Mountains) has been confirmed since 1990.


