
upper floret 1.5 mm long, yellow or brownish when mature; stigmas and anthers purple

panicles do not surpass the leaves; spikelets 2 mm long



Poaceae (Grass Family)

Phenology: flowering August to October.

Management Responsibility: BLM (AZ Strip Field Office).

Notes: fruiting plants 2.5-3 cm high are frequent. Otherwise known only from three plants on North Oscura Peak (New Mexico) in similar habitat; however, the species has not been seen since 1988 in this location.


