

Scrophulariaceae (Snapdragon Family)

Phenology: flowering/fruiting period is from late March to early June.

Management Responsibility: BLM (Kingman Field Office), AZ State Land Dept, private.

Similar Species: the white-margined leaves and low growth habitat make this species distinctive. However, it dies back to the ground after spring and positive identification of occupied habitat is no longer possible for much of the year.

Notes: a rare species throughout its range with three widely disjunct localities, Dutch Flat in Arizona, around Las Vegas, Nevada, and east of Barstow, California.

Penstemon albomarginatus



Habitat: sandy loam uplands and sandy wash bottoms, with Joshua tree/mixed shrub woodland in Arizona, 1,900-3,100 ft (580-945 m) elevation.

Range: three widely disjunct localities on the edges of the Mohave Desert; the largest population at Dutch Flat near Yucca; scattered small populations near Las Vegas, Nevada and Barstow, California.
