

Orchidaceae (Orchid Family)

Phenology: leaves appear in late April to early May; spike develops during May and June, flowering from mid-June through July; capsules mature in about one month.

Management Responsibility: USFS (Coconino NF), NPS (Grand Canyon NP, Navajo NM), Navajo Nation.

Synonyms: Limnorchis zothecina (Higgens & Welsh) W.A.Weber, Habenaria zothecina Higgens & Welsh.

Similar Species: distinguished from *Platanthera sparsiflora* by spur length, more rounded basal leaves, and a more elliptic lip.

Notes: widely scattered, nowhere in great numbers. Colonies appear stable, with plants still present in areas where they were reported over 60 years ago.



Habitat: found in seeps, stream side, in hanging gardens and in wet canyon alcoves, 5,000-9,000 ft (1525-2750 m) elevation. Requires constant moisture. Full to partial sun.
