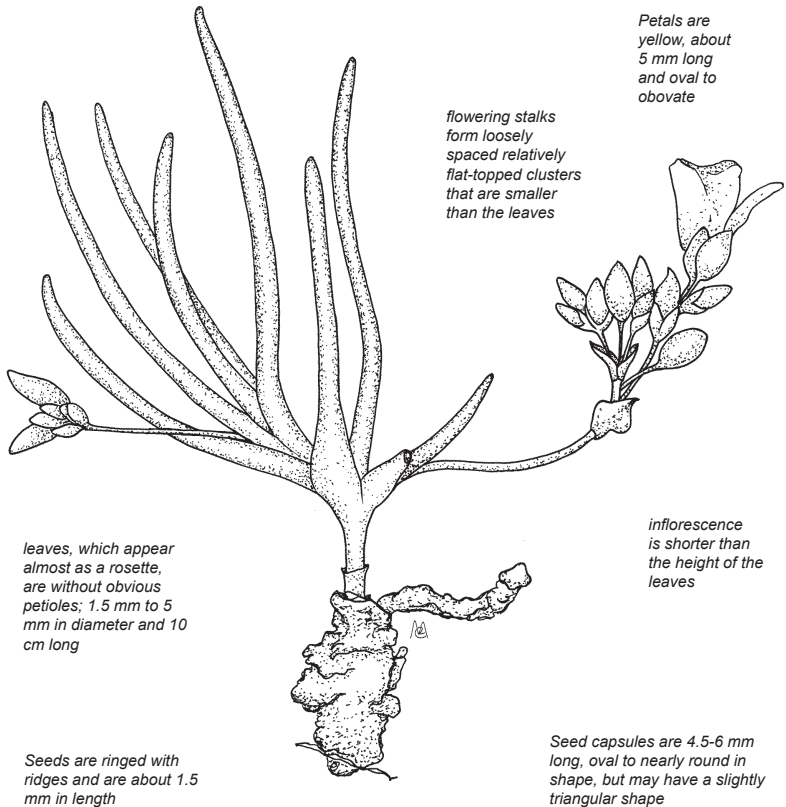


Dwarf perennial herb with round succulent leaves and a tuberous root, rarely > 5 cm in height



Portulacacea (Portulaca/Purslane Family)

Phenology: flowering mid-July to mid-August.

Management Responsibility: private.

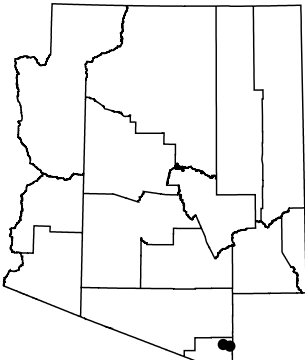
Synonyms: *Talinum greenmanii* Harshb.

Similar Species: *T. humile* leaves are without obvious petioles, in contrast to *T. marginatum*.

Talinum humile

Habitat: restricted to shallow, coarse, rhyolitic soil terraces overlying bedrock, where it is free from competitive interactions with other perennial plants at 4,000-5,000 ft (1220-1525 m) elevation.



Range: known only from four isolated locations in Canelo Hills, southeastern Arizona, and Piños Altos, southwestern New Mexico, and several localities in Durango, Chihuahua and D.F., Mexico.
